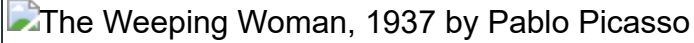


Pablo Picasso Portraits



Now that you have seen so many wonderful examples of Picasso's portraits in the style of Cubism you can try it for yourself!

Materials: Dice or spinner numbers or cards with numbers one through six, White paper, Picasso Portrait handout(or access to the video below), pencil, eraser, coloring tools(crayon, colored pencils or markers).

1. Turn you paper vertically (Portrait style/Tall and skinny).

Put your name in the bottom right hand corner of your paper.

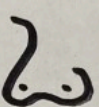
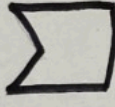
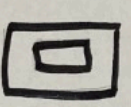
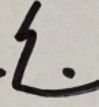
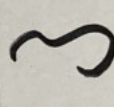
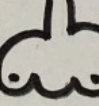
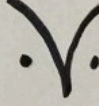
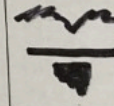
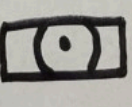
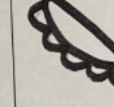
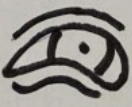
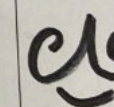
Look at the chart that is on the screen!

Roll the dice, spinner or pick a card at random and then draw each part of your portrait at random!

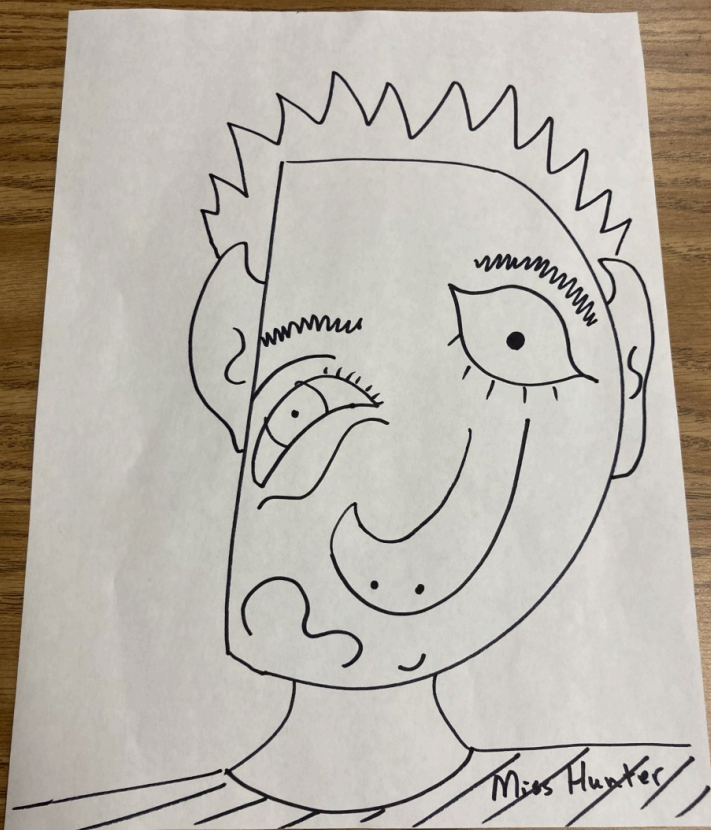
Make a Picasso
